SUNDAY SERVICE SUMMARY:

BECOMING GOD'S MAN!!

It might be surprising that our definition of a man differs greatly from God's. God defines a man as the one whose heart is perfect before Him (2 Chronicles 16:9).

In Ezekiel 22:30, the Bible says that God sought a man. That means that His kind of man was very scarce on the earth.

A man (or woman) becomes God's man by revelation and by responsibility; It's not a matter of biology at all. It's also not about age. When God finds a man He can use, He makes him a father regardless of age, race and status.

Roles of a Father:

He transmits purpose to his children or those he's fathering.

Purpose is the vision found in God (Genesis 45:1-11).

He is the foundation of his home. Everything is built on a foundation that itself must be built on the Rock, which is the Word of God. Why? So that when the rain, flood and winds of life blow (and they surely will), the foundation can still remain firm (Matthew 7:24-27).

He has the sole responsibility to provide for his family, just as God is our Provider (Proverbs 13:22). (1 Timothy 5:8). He sets precepts in his home (Genesis 18:17-19). If he doesn't, God can't use him. And even if God uses him for a while, it wouldn't

He is also supposed to set godly patterns (Hebrews 8:5). Patterns can be defined as due order. God loves order and expects His man to follow His order of doing things. The consequence for not following His order could be grace, as seen in 1 Chronicles 15:13.

How many boats and ships would have been enough to ferry a nation of about three million people, with their herds and possessions, across the river? This miracle was possible because Joshua and the children of Israel obeyed God's instructions.

As the feet of the priests bearing the ark of the covenant touched the river, it parted and stayed in heaps on both sides. Then, the children of Israel walked on the dry land of the riverbed of Jordan. What a miracle!

MIDWEEK SERVICE SUMMARY:

PRAYER PROJECTS!!

Prayer must be taught for answers to be obtained. (James 4:3). This is why the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray. A prayer project simply means praying according to God's purpose by asking God for the things He has already planned ahead for your life to be a reality.

Four Scriptural Foundations for Prayer Projects:

- Revelation of the Word of God (Daniel 9:1-3, Ezekiel 2:2, John 6:63, Isaiah 62:6-7, Ecclesiastics 11:3, Proverbs 28:9).
- By the desire of your heart (Mark 11:24, 1 John 5:15, Psalm 37:4, 2 Samuel 7:1-17, Isaiah 26:9)
- The burdens of the Lord (Habakkuk 1:1, Isaiah 13:1, Nahum 1:1, Malachi 1:1, Luke 2:25-26,36-37
- · Observe that God has an unmet need, then pray about them (1 Samuel 1:9-18).

The conditions upon which Prayer Project Work:

- Do not ask God to do what He has asked you in His Word. He has His part to play; you have yours (1 Corinthians 3:9).
- Make sure that what you're praying for is covered by His Word. (Philippians 2:12).
- · Operate from the place of rest, which means operating in faith.
- Make sure your motives are pure, not to show off or deal with people (Acts 24:16, Galatians 5:6

Practical Steps for Conducting a Prayer Project:

- 1. Find where it is written in the scripture.
- 2. Allocate specific times to pray about that project every day.
- 3. Make confessions based on the Word of God about what you're praying for.
- 4. Separate yourself from everything that is a bad influence on you.
- 5. Act in faith let your actions match your prayers.

Character Traits
