SUNDAY SERVICE SUMMARY: ENGAGING DIVINE WISDOM IN ADVENTURES WITH GOD

At times, we tend to undervalue things, especially gifts, when we fail to recognize their true worth. The Holy Spirit is the gift that God has bestowed upon us. However, often, due to our mindset, we limit His influence in our lives. Yet, His capabilities far exceed our imagination. In Isaiah 11:2, we find a multitude of roles the Holy Spirit fulfils: He is the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding

Wisdom brings stability (Isaiah 33:6). Growth and progress are impossible without stability. Therefore, if we find any form of stagnation in our lives, we need the wisdom that comes from God. The Bible describes divine wisdom as inherently pure (James 3:17). Even though we may have a close relationship with the Holy Spirit, He may not reveal everything to us. Sometimes, the answers we seek are already known by others.

Furthermore, the Holy Spirit is also the Spirit of understanding (Proverbs 21:16). Spiritual understanding, as outlined in Colossians 1:9, cannot be taught; it can only be acquired.

Additionally, the Holy Spirit embodies counsel and might. Psalm 112:1-2 illustrates the outcome when a person delights in God's Word. Counsel is the advice obtained through consultation. It is this counsel that empowers individuals. No one who lacks counsel can become or remain mighty.

The Counsel of God represents divine secrets, not readily available information.

Sources of Counsel include: 1. God (Jeremiah 23:18, 22). 2. God's servants (Exodus 18: 13-27). 3. Friends (2 Samuel 16:23, 1 Kings 12:6). 4. Personal reflection (Psalm 13:2).

MIDWEEK SERVICE SUMMARY:

THE MYSTERIES OF THE LORD'S TABLE

The Lord's Supper, also known as the Lord's Table, is an ordinance given by our Lord Jesus Christ to the Church. It means that whatever is served has been prepared by God. The Lord commands different ordinances, such as water baptism, washing of feet, and baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Observing the Last Supper is remembering Him (John 6:54). When we do this, we do so in faith, believing what Jesus said will happen when we take it. There are several benefits to observing the Lord's Table. Thus, we can expect to be imparted whenever we take the Holy Communion:

1. It imparts the life of God into us (John 6:51-53. Leviticus 17:11).

5. It imparts Divine Healing and Health to us (1 Peter 2:24. Matthew 8:17. 3 John 1:2.
