SUNDAY SERVICE SUMMARY:

OMNI FRIENDSHIP

Omni means 'Only'. It is a quality of God that is peculiar to Him alone. God's purpose is for us to have an Omni-friendship with Him. The whole aim of Redemption was to restore our relationship with divinity. (Genesis 3:8-10). To reestablish man's relationship with God — this is why Christianity is a relationship and not a religion. God wants to establish a friendship with us. (Ephesians 2:12).

There are three qualities that only God possesses, and He doesn't share them with

anyone else:
1. Omnipotent: The Almighty. (Revelations 19:6. Genesis 17:1-2).
2. Omniscient: The All Knowing. Oly wise God. (1 Timothy 1:17. John 1:5. Proverbs 4:7).
3. Omnipresent: Present everywhere at the same time. (Psalm 139:7-10).

Omnifriendship is an exclusive friendship between you and God. There are four levels of relationship with God.

Stranger Level: Those not born again and can't receive anything from God (Ephesians 2:12, 19; Ezekiel 5:5; Exodus 7:16).

Servant Level: God calls us to serve the world about Him.

Servant Level: Too calls is to serve the world about Hilm.

Sons Level: This is the level where you reflect God. Here, you feed on the pure milk of God's Word to continue to grow.

Friendship Level: This is the highest level of relationship. Friendship with God is a personal choice. On this level, you gain the following: (a) God reveals secrets to you. (b) Nothing in life will be or take you by surprise. (c) You become prophetic. (d) Your enemies become God's enemies. (e) You secure your generation.

3 Things that make relationships

a.Same Origin: You must be flowing from the same source. (Ezekiel 28:14-15. Acts 17:28. Deuteronomy 13:6).
b. Shared Values: Proverbs 12:26. John 15:7).
c.Shared Vision: (John15:14. Proverbs 12:28).

4 Ways to Love God:

Have an exclusive relationship with Him. Love only Him. (Exodus 20:2).
 Offer Him true worship (Exodus 20:3).
 Do not be profane (Godless). (Exodus 20:7).
 Spend quality time with Him daily. (Exodus 20:8).

MIDWEEK SERVICE SUMMARY:

DNA OF KINGDOM WEALTH

Riches are a product of the blessings of God. (Proverbs 10:22). This means that God wants us to be rich. Rich means the Full Supply of your Needs. (Matthew 5:17. Proverbs 20:29. Job 29:1-4). In the Kingdom of God, you need the following to be wealthy: -

- 1.Divine supply: God's favour, inspiration, opportunities, time & chance.
- 2.Diligence: hard work and diligence to execute God's inspiration.

3.Relationships with human beings.

Knowledge: What you know about your field of expertise.

To be wealthy, you must learn to observe and completely obey the last six commandments that deal with the horizontal relationships we have with human beings:

- Do Not Commit Adultery: signifies a lack of self-control/discipline. Master of your emotions, temper, appetites, etc. (Proverbs 16:32, 22:1, 26:28. 1 Corinthians 9:25. James 3:2).
- Do Not Murder: signifies hatred or resentful ill-will for others. God sees hatred as murder. Hatred is a corrosive acid that eats one from within. It limits and prevents you from accessing all God has purposed for you. (1 John 3:10-15. Jonah 4).

 Do Not Steal: signifies taking what has not been given to you. Be content with what God has given you; it is the only way to become creative/innovative. (Matthew 19:18. John 10:10. 2 Chronicles 16:9). When
- you are content, you will be grateful; when you are grateful, your eyes will open up to the next best thing. It is what you are thankful for that is multiplied.

 Do Not Bear False Witness: Be honest and authentic. Do not lie. Be upright. Your reputation is what gives you a seat in the palace. (Exodus 23:2) Samuel 16:16-18).
- Honour your Father and Mother: Honour (highly esteem) your parents and everyone regardless of age or status. Never look down on anyone. Handle your human relationships well. Honour is the code for elevation. When you esteem and treat people well (Mathew 19:19. Ephesians 6:1-3. 1 Peter 2:17. Philippians 2:3. 1 Samuel 30).
- Do Not Covet or Defraud anyone: Covetousness is borne out of a lack of love and envy. It is greed. (Leviticus 13:19). Do not cheat or owe people.

These are the software we need to reinstall and keep upgrading to download God's favour.



Building Quality Relationships - Part 2

The most important relationship to build is with God, but God also wants us to relate well with everybody.

The Bible tells us to owe no man nothing but love (Romans 13:8). Although we are to be cordial with everyone, we cannot be in fellowship with everyone, which is a deeper level of relating with anyone.

We cannot marry an unbeliever as believers (2 Corinthians 6:14). We must also carefully choose our friends (Proverbs 12:26).

The Bible says that a man is blessed when he doesn't stand in the way of sinners nor sit in the seat of mockers (Psalm 1:1).

A lot of emphasis is placed on seeking the direction of the Holy Spirit in choosing a spouse, but minimal emphasis is placed on seeking His direction in choosing our friends.

We will make mistakes if we don't rely on Him for this. We could even be led astray because evil communication corrupts good manners (1 Corinthians 15:33). We are to trust the Lord and not lean on our own understanding in everything (Proverbs 3:5-6), including our choice of friends.

God is very particular about our relationships. Let the Holy Spirit guide who we allow into our lives and how we relate to the people around us.

Post-Registering Requirements (Part 4)

Compliance and Annual Returns Filing With CAC: Compliance with regulatory requirements and submission of annual returns are vital to maintaining a company's good standing with Nigeria's Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC).

Definition of Annual Returns and Its Importance: Annual returns are a statutory requirement under the Companies and Allied Matters Act (CAMA), where companies submit information about their operational and financial status to the CAC. This requirement is crucial because it clarifies the company's activities and ensures that the CAC's records are current.

Content of Annual Returns: Annual returns typically include the registered address, directors, shareholders, share capital, and financial statements. The document reflects any changes in company details throughout the year, such as changes in directorship or company structure.

Timeframe for Submission of Annual Returns: Companies must file their annual returns no later than 30 days after the anniversary of the company's incorporation.

Implications of Non-Compliance of Annual Returns: Failure to file annual returns can incur penalties, eventually resulting in the company being struck off the register.

Procedure for Filing Annual Returns: The process of filing annual returns has been significantly simplified through the CAC's online portal. If necessary, Companies must update their account details and then fill out the annual return forms online.

Document Submission: Companies must submit financial statements and a directors' report along with the completed annual return form.

Payment of Fees: A fee is required to file annual returns; the amount varies depending on the company's share capital.

Professional Assistance: While it is possible to complete the filing independently, many companies engage legal professionals or chartered accountants to ensure accuracy and compliance with all regulatory requirements.

Confirmation of Filing of Annual Returns: Once companies complete the filing and pay the fee, they receive a confirmation from the CAC, which they can print as evidence of compliance.

Ongoing Compliance: Good corporate governance practices must be maintained throughout the year to ensure that the information in the annual returns reflects the company's current status.

Complying with CAC requirements is a legal obligation and contributes to a company's integrity and reputation. It reinforces stakeholders' confidence and can positively impact potential investments and partnerships. Keeping accurate records throughout the year, understanding the requirements, and meeting deadlines are critical to submitting an annual return hassle-free.
