### SUNDAY SERVICE SUMMARY:

#### **THE BLESSINGS OF FAITHFULNESS!!**

Faithfulness means being consistently consistent. Finding faithful people on earth today is a scarce commodity (Proverbs 20:6, Psalm 12:1, Proverbs 28:20). Whatever you do, if you are not faithful, you will not succeed.

Being faithful is not just about being present or available. It's about being fruitful, about making a difference wherever you are (Luke 13:6-9). It's about leaving a positive mark on every situation and person you encounter.

Several aspects of faithfulness are noteworthy. These include:

- We must be faithful in the little, seemingly insignificant things (Luke 16:10).
- Faithfulness is proof of the fear of God and a perfect heart (2 Chronicles 19:8-9). It is proof of honesty and truthfulness (2 Kings 22:4-7).
- We are God's stewards and are expected to be faithful (1 Corinthians
- 4.2)
- We must be faithful in another man's business if we want our own (Luke 16:12).

There are several blessings associated with faithfulness.

- It brings supernatural promotion (Nehemiah 7:2). Faithfulness brings divine preservation (Psalm 31:23, Exodus 34:24).
- Faithfulness draws God's attention towards us (Psalm 101:6).
- It is the basis for supernatural prosperity and divine blessings (Proverbs 28:20).
- It qualifies us to inherit the kingdom of God and for enthronement (Luke 22:28-30).


God can trust no one until they have been tested and found faithful. A test always precedes promotion.


Have you given up hope or written off this year as bad? God will show you mercy and favour in this second half in Jesus' name.

## MIDWEEK SERVICE SUMMARY: FLOURISHING AT YOUR APPOINTED PLACE!!

There is a 'THERE' for every Believer. It is your 'THERE' that God commands His blessings for you. Wherever God plants you (with an emphasis on the church) is a good land for you, and you'll have opportunities for enlargement there, which will also flow with milk and honey. (Psalm 132:17, 133:3. Exodus 3:8),

To eat and enjoy the good of the land where God has planted you, you must be willing and obedient (Isaiah 1:19). Here are 2 things that stop you from enjoying your planted place (Exodus 33:3): (1). Pride and Stubbornness. (2). Unforgiveness and Disobedience.

3 laws you must keep when you enter your appointed place are:

1.The Law of Connections - there are 3 levels:

- i.Connection to Jesus Christ: Being born again, you cannot be fruitful without Him (Romans 11:17,24. Colossians 2:19. Isaiah 11:10, 11:1. John 15:4-6).
- ii.Connection to your pastor: (Psalm 133:2. 1 Timothy 5:17. John 6:29. 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13. John 10:3-5).
- iii.Connection to members of the church. (Luke 10:1. Matthew 18:19-20. Acts 6:3.). You must live in unity with other believers.

2.The Law of Customs: These are repeated spiritual disciplines that come out of revelation from scriptures. (2 Kings 17:24-28. Numbers 8:8-10. Proverbs 8:17, 34. Exodus 25:40. 2 Corinthians 11:2). Certain patterns are followed here in Hermon – we pray into every new month (Numbers 10:8-10). We also observe personal quiet time with God. As you practice these customs, the grace of God will start to flow in your life (2 Thessalonians 2:15).

3.The Law of Communion. The Christian life can't be lived in isolation; it's dangerous (Jude 1:19. Psalm 68:6. Matthew 18:19. Acts 2:42, 4:23. Daniel 2:1-23. Proverbs 18:24). You must be genuinely yoked in fellowship with church members.

#### "Her husband can trust her....." (Proverbs 31: 11).

In our previous discussion, we delved into the profound concept of honesty and its role in fostering trust. We underscored the significance of abstaining from falsehood, for it is a trait of the adversary, and as God's children, we are called to a higher standard of truthfulness. We firmly established that a person's trustworthiness is directly linked to their honesty.

But there is another aspect to building trust and that is being faithful. I'll explain by asking a question. Can people trust you to do a task well without being supervised, especially when it doesn't seem to directly and/or immediately affect or benefit you?

The Bible says that every steward is expected to be faithful (1 Corinthians 4:2). You know what the drill is? Jesus mentioned it in Luke Ió:12, "And if you are not faithful with other people's things, why should you be trusted with things of your own?"

### Thrive: Fundamentals of Pre-Martial Relationship

Being married is a whole different ball game from being single. The responsibilities increase tremendously. And marriage is really important to God. So, if as a single person you're not responsible in other people's business, why would God want to give you your own? God is a God of abundance but He genuinely hates waste. So what He does is that He puts you in places and with people that'll train you and build your capacity to handle things. If you don't submit yourself to those people and trainings now as one who's yet to be married, honestly you are training yourself for trouble when you're married.

Remember that we have stated that it is how you are as a single person that you will remain when you are married. So, if there are areas in your life now that you know you aren't faithful in, ask the HolySpirit to help you; He is our Helper. But make sure to submit to Him by obeying Him when He gives you instructions.
